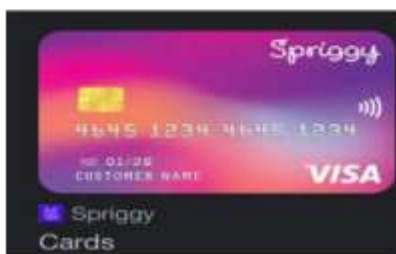

MIXING A SOLID AND LIQUID TO CREATE A GAS

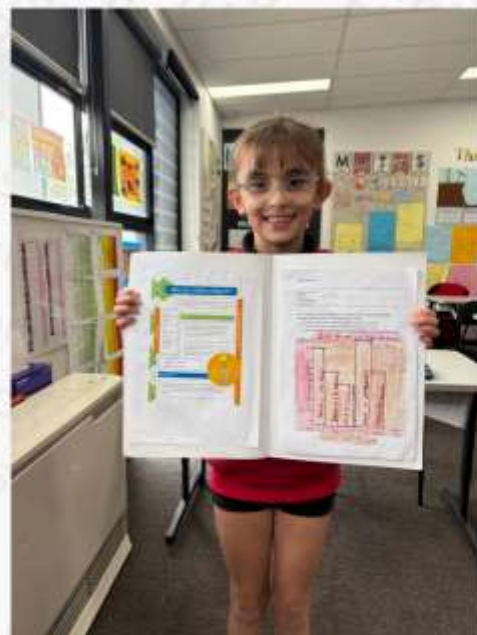
EFFECT OF BICARB SODA ON BALLOON SIZE.

The Grade 3/4s are learning about Chemical Science this Term. We completed an experiment, mixing a liquid (vinegar) and a solid (Bicarb Soda) together, to create a gas and see how much it would blow up a balloon.



HERE IS RUBY'S DESCRIPTION OF OUR EXPERIMENT.

"I saw the bicarb flowing up to the top and it was AMAZING how it blew up and flowed back to the bottom. When the balloon blew, it was like a hot air balloon. It was like I was in it! It felt really cool but also scary to see it blow up. I squealed a little bit. The balloon got 45cm big in diameter and we used 10g of bicarb soda. It was so surprising."

Labelling Personal Items & Lost Property

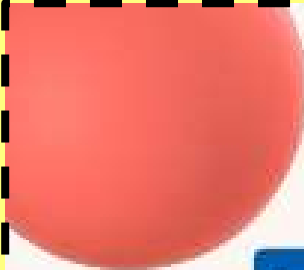
Can we please remind families to label all items of clothing, hats, lunchboxes, containers and drink bottles so we can return them to students.

Our Fabulous Junior Collection

With the school year coming to a close we want to let you know how the Romsey Library is placed to support your child's learning journey.

Decodable Readers – With the introduction of the government mandate for schools to teach students to read using phonics, our packs of decodable readers are an excellent supplement to school readers. We have most common publishers, and you will likely find the readers your school uses on our catalogue. Speak to library staff for assistance.

Graphic Novels – popular titles including Baby-Sitters Club, Pokémon, Dog Man and TinTin.

Junior Fiction - up to date with current trends, titles and series.

Junior Non-Fiction - a range of texts to support interests and project work.

Picture Books - new titles arriving regularly as well as the old favourites. Our collection includes board books suitable from birth, through to older reader picture books.

Our staff at the Romsey Library are very happy to help all our young readers find reading material to suit their taste and level of reading; we are confident that we will find something for even the most reluctant readers!

We are also able to help source books on specific themes or subjects to support school projects and home school lesson plans.

Our collection also includes audiobooks and eBooks which can be easily accessed from most devices.

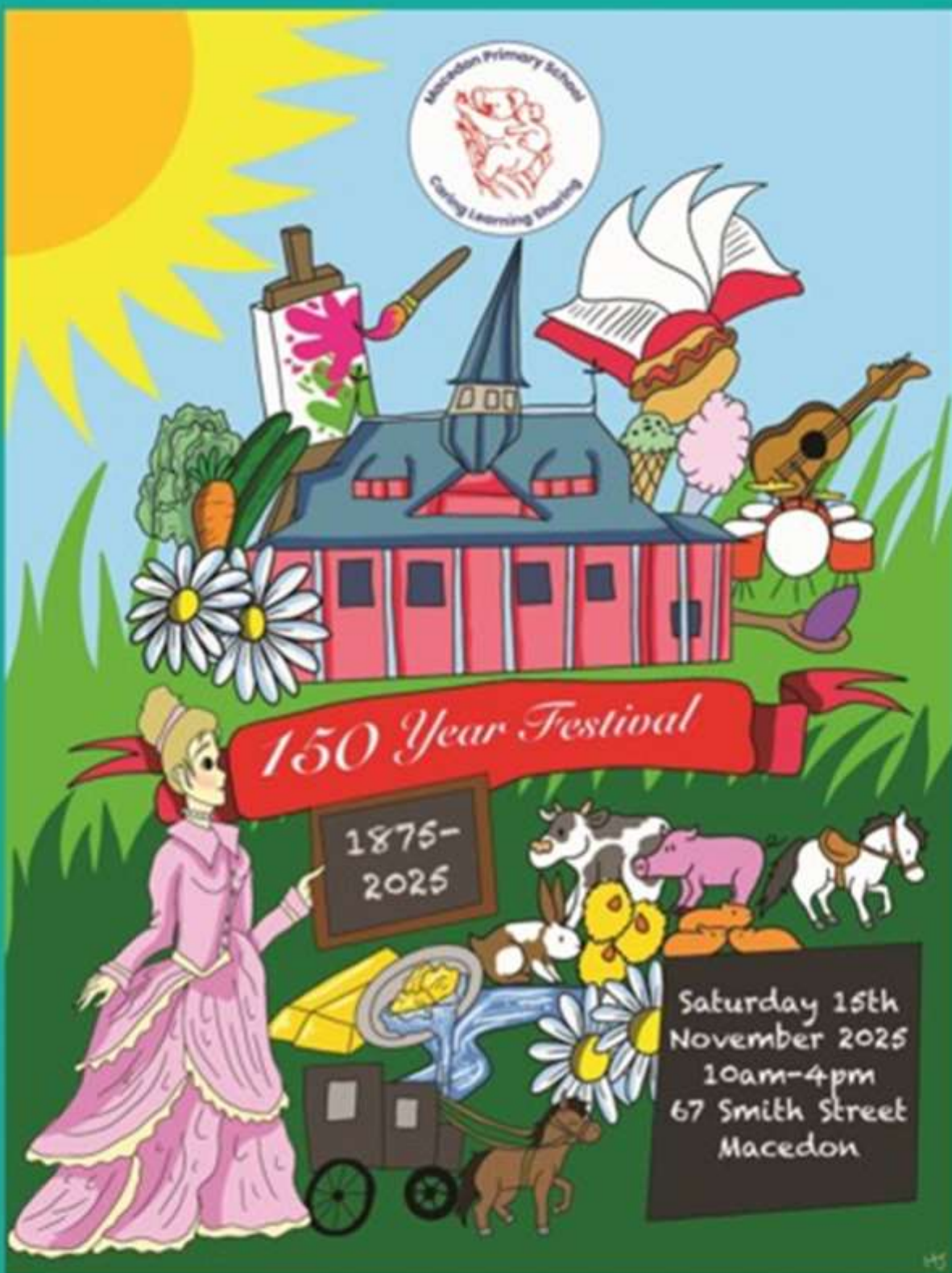


A Sensory Space for Children at the Romsey Library. Tuesday, 2.30 – 4.30 PM during the School Term.

It can sometimes be overwhelming though. Loud noises and glaring lights – we've all felt the need to sit somewhere quiet and shut out the world for a time.

On **Tuesday afternoons**, between **2.30 and 4.30 PM**, the Romsey library is switching off the lights in the children's area and asking all patrons to minimise noise. We have comfortable couches and soft cushions to help you relax. There are fidget toys available to borrow if you need to keep your hands busy while you read or listen to a story.
