Our canteen staff rely on the correct information from the Qkr! app to be able to deliver your child's lunch order to the correct classroom. Please check the app to make sure your child's correct class is entered. This doesn't automatically update each year, you need to edit it. Please find instructions below to assist you to update your child's profile.

A reminder that March Meal Deal Day will take place on Friday 27th March. Orders can be made via the Qkr! app & close on Friday 20th March.

Please be advised that during extremely busy times, the office phone may ring out and divert to our message bank service.

We kindly ask that if this happens, please leave a message and we will return your call as soon as possible.

Please refrain from calling the office again straight away as messages are usually responded to promptly.

We thank you for your patience.

Student Enrolment Information

Each year we are required by the Department Of Education to send home current enrolment information for families to update and return to the school.

By now you should have received an email with your child's current enrolment information for you to review.



We ask that you please read this information carefully and do one of the following:

- * If there are changes that need to be made to your child's enrolment, please mark the relevant changes on the form, sign and date it and return it to the office via email or a paper copy
- OR**
- * If there are no changes to your child's enrolment, **please remove the first page only**, sign and date it and then return it to the office via email or paper copy.

Please do not return the entire form if there are no changes to be made, we only require the signed front page.

Student Medication

If your child requires medication whilst at school parents/guardians must sign a 'Permission To Administer Medication' form. These forms are available from the office and must be completed by a parent or guardian only. **We can not legally administer any medication to students without this form.**

Important **INFORMATION**

RPS Late Arrivals & Early Departures Procedure

Please remember that if your child is late to school they must present to the office before heading to class to obtain a late pass. This eliminates absence notifications being sent to parents causing unnecessary worry.

If you need to collect your child early from school, please present to the front office to obtain an 'Early Departure' slip from the school Compass Kiosk iPad **before heading to your child's classroom**. Office staff will happily assist with this if needed.

In an emergency you may phone the school to arrange for your child to be brought to the office for collection otherwise all parents/guardians are required to collect their child from their classroom to minimise announcements and interruptions to other classes.

If you need to pick up your child for an appointment, we kindly ask that you arrive 5-10 minutes earlier to allow time to collect your child from their classroom.

For safety reasons, can we please remind families that only people listed as emergency contacts are able to collect your child. If you would like someone to collect your child on your behalf and they are not listed as an emergency contact, you must notify the school accordingly either by phone or email.

If you are not sure who you have listed as emergency contacts for your child, please enquire at the office. A maximum of 4 people can be listed for each family.

If you know in advance that you will not be able to arrive on time it is important for alternate arrangements to be made or to contact the Out of School Hours Program to see if there are any available spaces. This will ensure that your child is suitably supervised.

(Schools Out –Out of School Hours Program number is 1300329106 or Kidzone - Out of School Hours Program number is 0481 212 047)

Just a reminder that assembly is held every Monday afternoon at 2.50pm, therefore if you need to pick up your child early on a Monday, we strongly recommend you arrive before 2.50pm.

We thank everyone for their cooperation and understanding.

How do I report an absence?

We kindly ask that if you need to report an absence please do so by pressing '1' when you call the main number wherever possible.

This option is a dedicated phone line for absences and prevents phone congestion each morning.

The quickest and easiest way to notify the school of your child's absence is via the Compass app. You can also enter absences in advance using Compass.

If your child is absent and an explanation is not provided, parents will be sent an SMS asking them to contact the school. We kindly ask that you contact the office so we can record your child's absence as per the Department Of Education's regulations. Again, you can leave a message on the absence voicemail by pressing '1'.

Unwell Students

Please remember that if your child is displaying any virus or gastro like symptoms and/or is saying they are feeling unwell please keep your child home until they are symptom free.

If your child is sent to the sick bay feeling unwell or showing virus like symptoms, parents will be called to collect their children as soon as possible.

If any students develop symptoms at home we ask that parents keep their children home until they are symptom free.



HEAD LICE

It has come to our attention that a number of students across the school may have head lice and we seek your cooperation in checking your child's hair.

Head lice do not transmit infectious diseases – they are transmitted by having head-to-head contact with someone who has head lice. Head lice are common in school-aged children and are the most adaptable of creatures. They have survived living solely on humans for 10,000 years!

What can you do?

We seek your cooperation in checking your child's hair and in those instances where head lice or eggs are found, treating your child's hair.

If head lice or eggs are found on your child's hair, you need to inform:

- the school and advise when the treatment has started.
- parents or carers of your child's friends so they too have the opportunity to detect and treat their children if necessary.

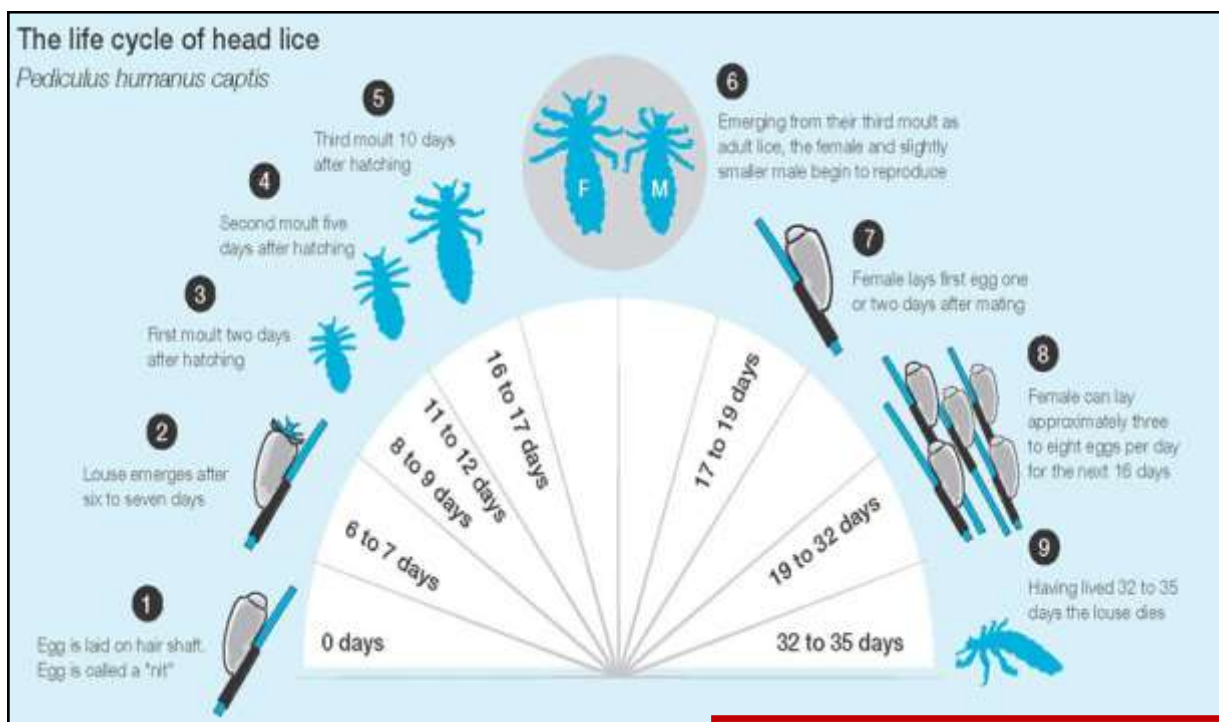
When can my child return to school?

Health regulations require that where a child has head lice, that child should not return to school until the day after appropriate treatment has started. Please note, this refers only to those children who have live head lice and does not refer to head lice eggs.

Romsey Primary is aware that head lice can be a sensitive issue and is committed to maintaining your confidentiality.

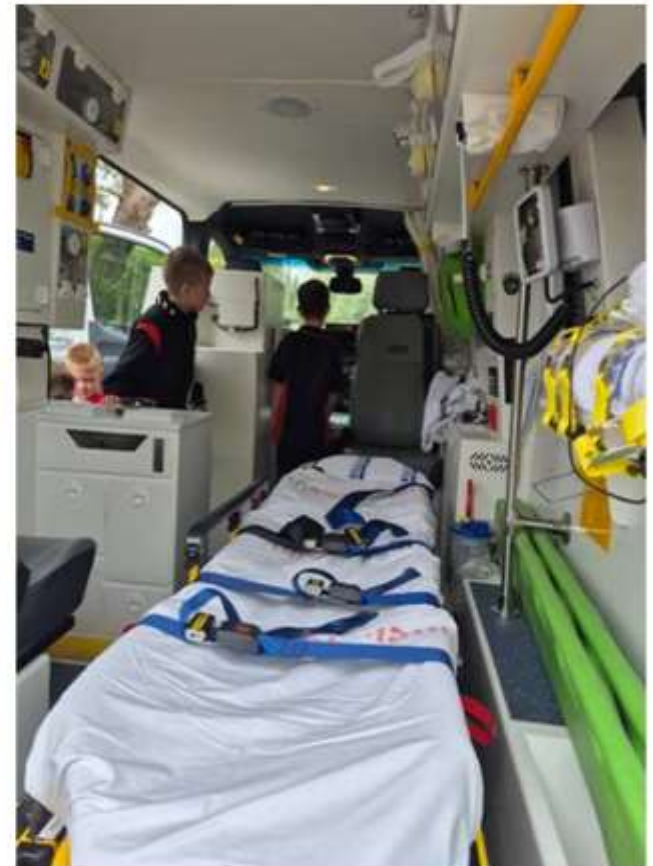
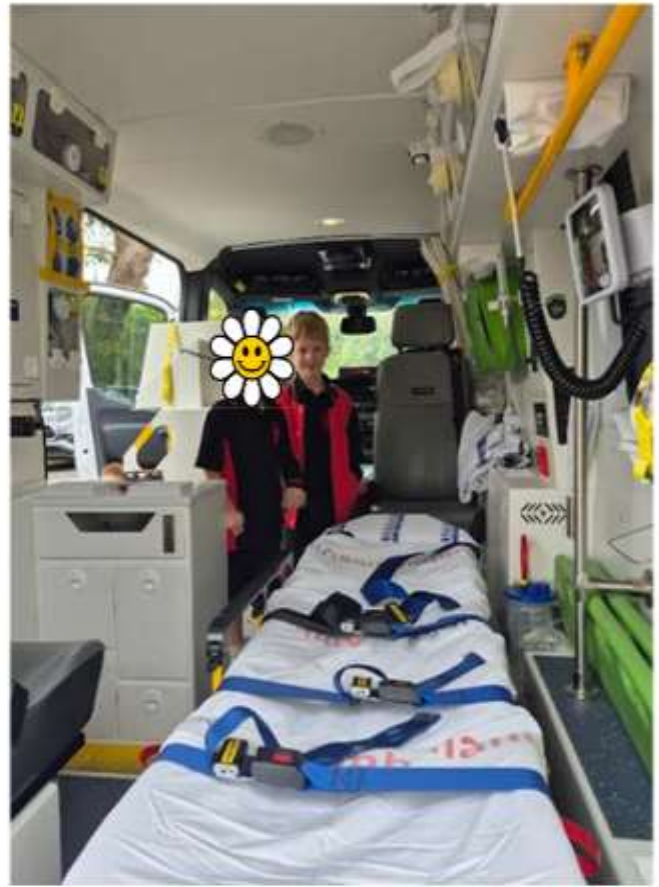
Paramedic Visit

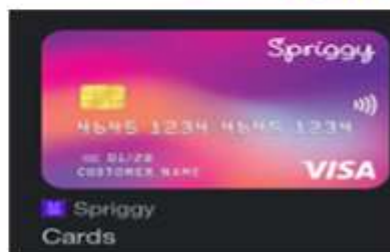

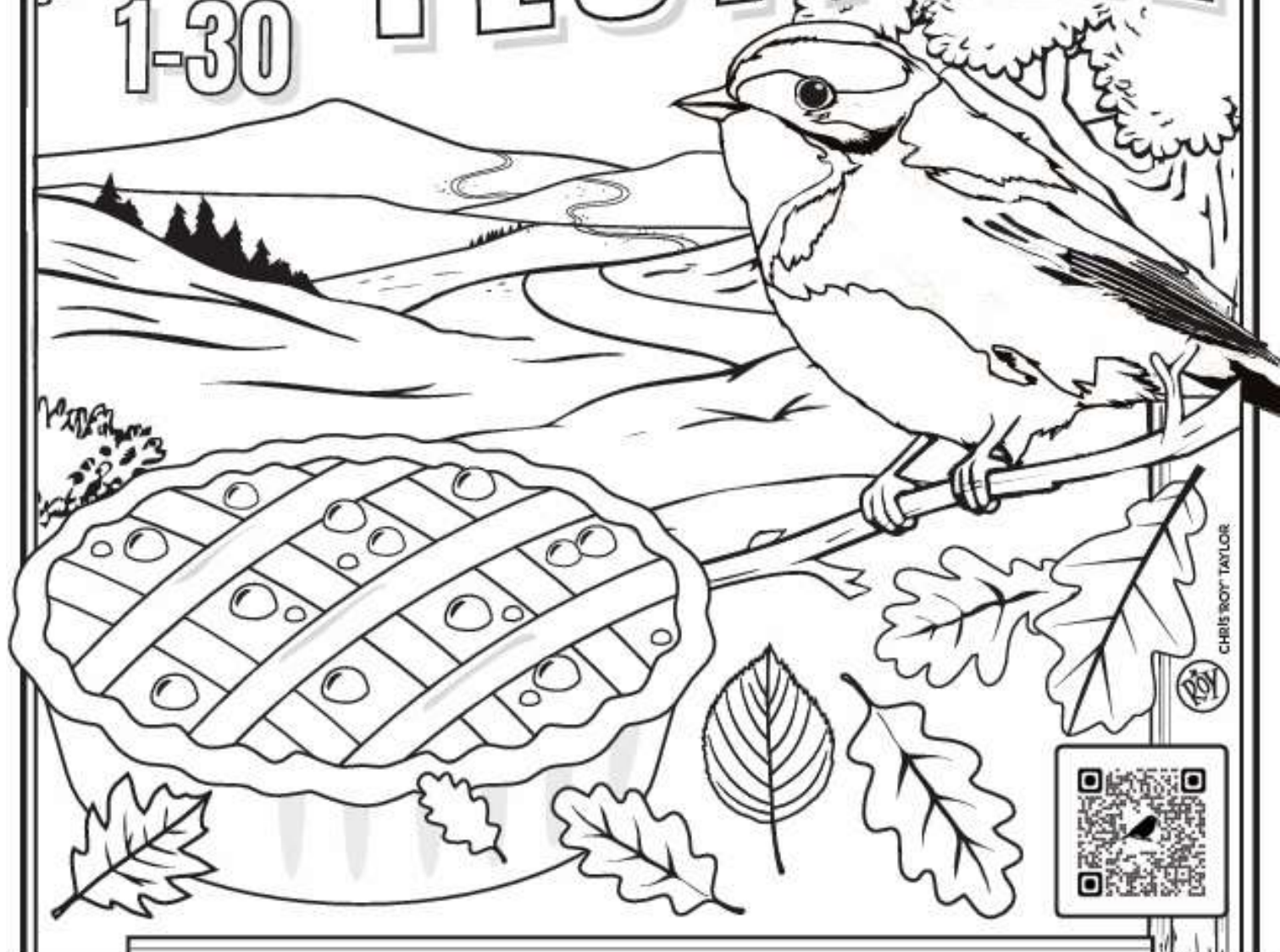

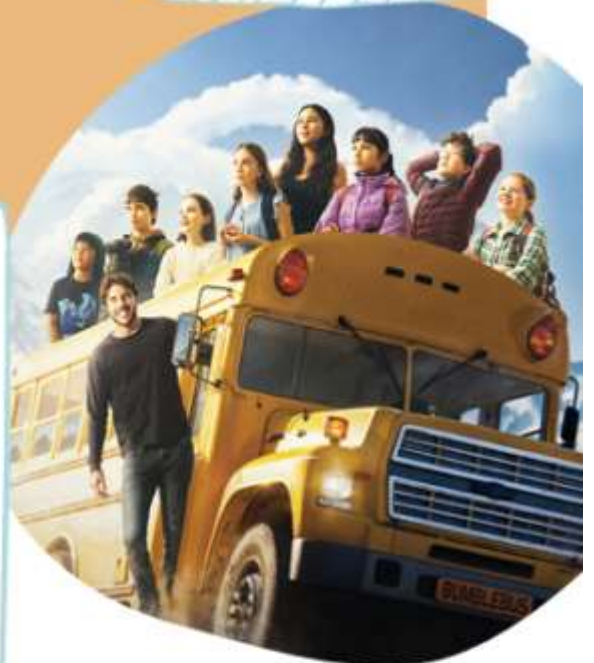
