UNIFORM

Canteen


Please remember orders for the canteen automatically cut off on Qkr at 9:00am sharp each day so please ensure you place your orders early to avoid disappointment.

Lost Property


Once again we find our lost property tubs filled to the brim with jackets, coats, hats, drink bottles and much loved toys!




As we wind down towards the end of the year we need to make sure that all library books are returned. There will be no borrowing after Wednesday November 29th.

As hayfever season is now upon us can we kindly ask that if your child suffers from hayfever and you have not provided the office with medication for your child that you please administer a dose of their regular antihistamine before leaving for school each morning.

Alternatively parents/guardians can complete the "Permission To Administer Medication' form on the next page and return it to the office along with a clearly labelled box/bottle of your child's regular medication so that the office can administer this medication when symptoms flare.

Please note that if your child suffers from hayfever/rashes regularly, it is advisable that medication be given before coming to school during the hayfever season to ensure your child is comfortable during the day.

Please note that parents will be notified by email when your child has been given their medication.

Office staff are unable to administer any medication to your child without completing the above mentioned form.

We ask that you do not send your child to school with medication in their bag. Medication must be given to office staff by a parent or guardian.

RPS Late Arrivals & Early Departures Procedure



Please remember that if your child is late to school they <u>must</u> present to the office before heading to class to obtain a late pass. This eliminates absence notifications being sent to parents causing unnecessary worry.

If you need to collect your child early from school, please present to the front office to obtain an 'Early Departure' slip from the school Kiosk iPad before heading to your child's classroom.

Office staff will happily assist with this if needed.

In an emergency you may phone the school to arrange for your child to be brought to the office for collection otherwise all parents/guardians are required to collect their child from their classroom to minimise announcements and interruptions to other classes.

If you need to pick up your child for an appointment, we kindly ask that you arrive 5-10 minutes earlier to allow time to collect your child from their classroom.

For safety reasons, can we please remind families that only people listed as emergency contacts are able to collect your child. If you would like someone to collect your child on your behalf and they are not listed as an emergency contact, you must notify the school accordingly either by phone or email.

If you are not sure who you have listed as emergency contacts for your child, please enquire at the office. A maximum of 4 people can be listed for each family.

If you know in advance that you will not be able to arrive on time it is important for alternate arrangements to be made or to contact the Out of School Hours Program to see if there are any available spaces. This will ensure that your child is suitably supervised. (The Kidzone Out of School Hours Program number is 0481 212 047)

Just a reminder that assembly is held every Monday afternoon at 3pm, therefore if you need to pick up your child early on a Monday, we strongly recommend you arrive before 3pm.

Student Dress Code



Help for non-English speakers

If you need help to understand the information in this policy please contact Mrs Melanie Stewart, Principal, Romsey Primary School.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline Romsey Primary's School requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes.

This dress code has been developed by Romsey Primary School's School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

The Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support Example School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities.
- reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

The School Council has developed a dress code that we believe provides a range of choices for students and is cost effective for families.

SCOPE

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while traveling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

Examples of the School's compulsory school uniform items are as follows:

General appearance

While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, Example School students must comply with the following:

- Uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- Uniforms must be clearly marked with the owner's name

 Additional layers of clothing may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth, provided these undergarments are completely hidden.

Jewellery and cosmetics

Students are not permitted to wear decorative jewellery to school. Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, and watches, are the only acceptable jewellery.

Cosmetics may not be worn at school. Only clear nail polish is permitted.

Hair and Sun safety

Shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back to help restrict the spread of nits and lice and for student safety.

School uniform full brimmed hats must be worn outside from mid-August (exact date to be set by the school annually) to 30 April and on any other day prescribed by the school. School uniform hats (red or black) may also be worn outside of this time period, by parent or student choice. Headwear compliant with religious faiths may be worn in conjunction with Sunsmart hats. As a general guideline, students are to wear hats in Term 1 and 4. We are a Sun Smart school.

In winter, students are encouraged to wear winter beanies which are plain red or black.

Hats are not to be worn inside.

Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities. Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wrap-around that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

Sports tops are available for when students are representing the school. The tops need to be returned to the school within one week of the event, laundered. Unreturned items will incur a replacement fee.

Footwear

Suitable footwear and socks include black school shoes, white or black runners with black/white socks or black tights.

Inappropriate footwear includes thongs, open toed shoes, Crocs, high heels, ballet flats and wheelie shoes are not recommended.

Support for families experiencing difficulty

Please contact the Principal, Assistant Principal or business manager to discuss support that we may be able to provide to families experiencing difficulty meeting uniform costs, including information about eligibility for uniform support through State Schools' Relief. Uniforms are available to families to borrow on request. The school actively promotes the donation of quality second hand uniforms. Please hand these used uniform into the office.

Second Hand Uniform Shop

The second hand uniform shop is open throughout each term, access to items in the shop can be arranged at other times. (Please seek further information from the school front office).

IMPLEMENTATION

Romsey Primary School will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website and other methods of communication. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

Students wearing non-compliant uniform items may be asked to change into a compliant item of clothing provided by the school.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Dress Code on a recurring basis, a note will be provided to the student and parents by the classroom teacher. If non-compliance with the dress code becomes a continued occurrence, the Principal will be informed and a phone call home may be required. In this event, the school will continue to work with the student and family to support compliance.

Measures taken by Romsey primary School to address concerns about student non-compliance with the Student Dress Code will also be addressed in accordance with our Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy.

All new families will be informed of the school's Uniform Policy upon enrolment and/or during the transition program.

EXEMPTIONS TO STUDENT DRESS CODE

We recognise that there may be situations where the application of this dress code may affect students unequally.

Students and their parents or carers may apply either in writing or in person to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

 an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs or background

- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate particular economic hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents or carers.

CONCERNS ABOUT THIS STUDENT DRESS CODE

ROMSEY PRIMARY SCHOOL welcomes feedback from the school community in relation to this Student Dress Code. If you have a concern or complaint about the Student Dress Code, further information about raising a concern or complaint is available in our school's *Parent Complaint Policy*.




