#### Canteen

Please remember orders for the canteen automatically cut off on Qkr at 9:00am sharp each day so please ensure you place your orders early to avoid disappointment.

If you have placed a lunch order via the QKR app and then your child is absent on that day, please contact the office **before 10:00am** to notify us so we can provide your child's lunch order when they return to school. After this time food is thawed and preparation begins therefore a credit or refund will not be given.

Please note that the canteen will close on Friday 15th December for the year.

#### **Unwell Students**

Please remember that if your child is displaying any virus or gastro like symptoms and/or is saying they are feeling unwell please keep your child home until they are symptom free. If your child is sent to the sick bay feeling unwell or showing virus like symptoms, parents will be called to collect their children as soon as possible.

If any students develop symptoms at home we ask that parents keep their children home until they are symptom free.



#### **Lost Property**

## **Important**

## **Collection Of Medication**

Please be advised that as part of our 'End Of Year' procedure, all prescription medication on-site will need to be picked up on or before your child's last day of school for the year by either a parent, guardian or an listed emergency contact.

No prescription medication will be held over the holidays for the next school year as these medications can expire during long periods of time and dosages may change after medical appointments during the school holidays

This includes prescription medication, Epipens and asthma puffers. Pain relief and antihistamines can remain at school if not needed during the holiday break.

If your child requires medication next year, please complete the 'Permission To Administer Medication' form attached to the newsletter and return it to the office with your child's medication when your child returns to school in the new year.

We kindly ask that if your child requires half tablet doses whilst at school, that tablets are halved before bringing to the office and that all medication is clearly labelled on either the original box/bottle or a photocopy of the box/bottle.

We also ask that if your child has an asthma, allergy or anaphylaxis plan, that you ensure these are updated by your GP in time for the new year with a recent photo of your child.





# RPS Late Arrivals & Early Departures Procedure



Please remember that if your child is late to school they <u>must</u> present to the office before heading to class to obtain a late pass. This eliminates absence notifications being sent to parents causing unnecessary worry.

If you need to collect your child early from school, please present to the front office to obtain an 'Early Departure' slip from the school Kiosk iPad before heading to your child's classroom.

Office staff will happily assist with this if needed.

In an emergency you may phone the school to arrange for your child to be brought to the office for collection otherwise all parents/ guardians are required to collect their child from their classroom to minimise announcements and interruptions to other classes.

If you need to pick up your child for an appointment, we kindly ask that you arrive 5-10 minutes earlier to allow time to collect your child from their classroom.

For safety reasons, can we please remind families that only people listed as emergency contacts are able to collect your child. If you would like someone to collect your child on your behalf and they are not listed as an emergency contact, you must notify the school accordingly either by phone or email.

If you are not sure who you have listed as emergency contacts for your child, please enquire at the office. A maximum of 4 people can be listed for each family.

If you know in advance that you will not be able to arrive on time it is important for alternate arrangements to be made or to contact the Out of School Hours Program to see if there are any available spaces. This will ensure that your child is suitably supervised. (The Kidzone Out of School Hours Program number is 0481 212 047)

Just a reminder that assembly is held every Monday afternoon at 3pm, therefore if you need to pick up your child early on a Monday, we strongly recommend you arrive before 3pm.

## Below are a couple of TIPS from Susan's fact sheet on 'Internet Safety Tips for Parents, Teachers & Carers'

- The use of computers, laptops or any internet enabled devices (iPad, phone, iPod, Xbox) SHOULD be in a common area of the house NOT IN THE BEDROOM! Need an alarm – buy a clock radio!
- Parental monitoring is vital walk past and see what your child is doing, who they are talking to and what sites they are on....be aware if their mood changes. This is NOT invading their privacy at all...it is parenting in the digital space.
- Make sure there is no response to rude or harassing emails. (keep a record in case of further investigation).
- Children Under 13 ARE NOT ALLOWED on Facebook, Instagram, Kik, SnapChat, iTunes and many more. Don't support your child to break the rules & they won't be the only one without these accounts. Learn to say NO!

and leave us all with this little message regarding 'Technology' especially during the Christmas holidays.

#### Time Away From Technology

Sometimes technology and social media can be a lifeline but sometimes they can be completely overwhelming and it feels like notifications and messages are never ending. When we feel like we are constantly attached to everyone and all that is happening in the wider world it can become exhausting. That's one of the reasons why lots of people find time away from social media a really important part of their daily self-care (even if it does feel weird at first!) There are, ironically, a range of apps which can help you manage your use of technology. The Space App is a personalised behaviour change programme designed to help you think about how you use your phone and how it affects your life. It helps you to see the opportunities to put down your phone and to look up at the world around you.

A reminder that our kids also need this approach. Putting devices in a box during meal times and at night can help with the temptation to "check" just in case! It also helps increase the connection within your family and builds conversation. We need to remember that the positives of internet access, communication and entertainment in our current world also poses risks. Monitoring your child's usage can help establish healthy habits. It is also highly recommended that children do not have access to devices in their bedrooms at night.

Although we do provide our students with cyber safety awareness teaching, putting them into practise away from the classroom remains a challenge for young minds.













